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1. Methodology

Data Collection

This study was conducted Australia-wide via 3rd-party panel provider from 4 November - 14 November 2022.

The study was conducted among a sample of 2605 people aged 18 years and over from a population of 26 million.

Weighting

Following the completion of the surveys, the data was cell-weighted by gender and age to reflect local population proportions.

The effective sample size following weighting is 2509 meaning the effective margin of error is +/-2%.

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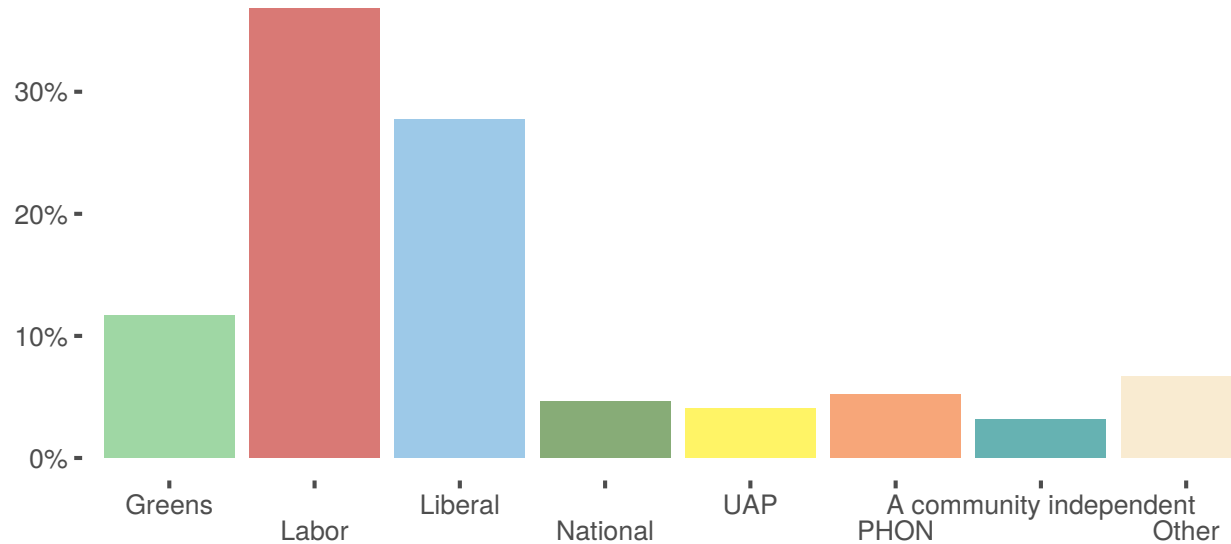

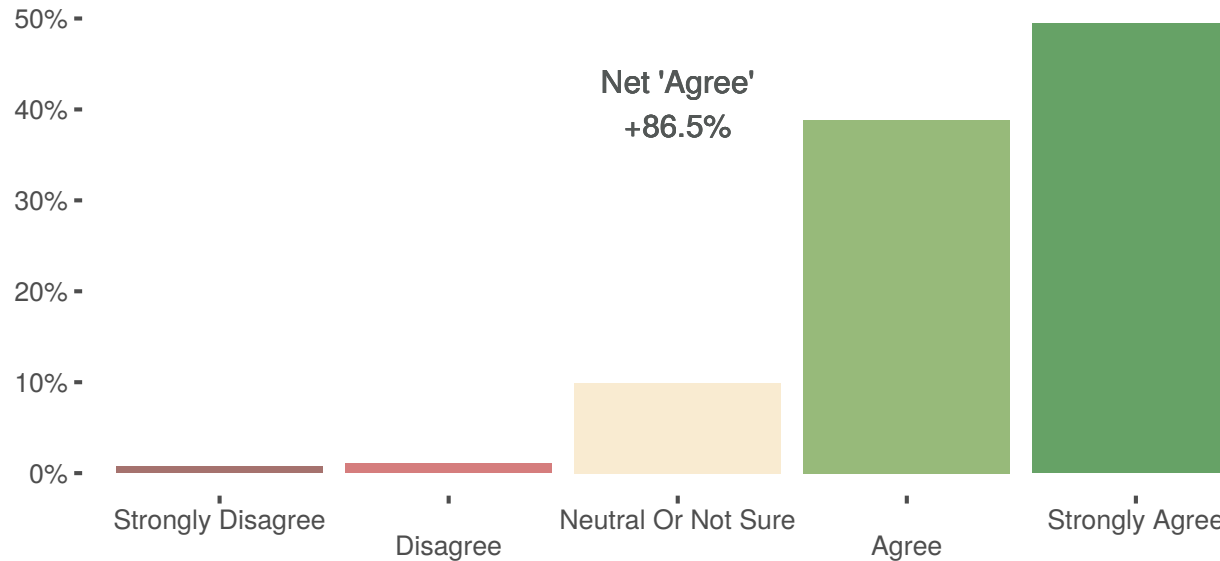
